Audit opinion - Qualified

Except for the matters reported in my Basis for Qualification below, on the basis of my review, in my opinion no matters have come to my attention giving cause for concern that in any material respect, the information reported in this Annual Return:

- has not been prepared in accordance with proper practices;
- that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met;
- is not consistent with the Council's/Committee's governance arrangements; and
- that the Council/Committee does not have proper arrangements in place to secure economy, efficiency and effectiveness in its use of resources.

Basis of qualification

Accounting statement

I am unable to conclude whether or not the Accounting Statement properly presents the Council's income and expenditure and financial position for both the 2019-20 and 2018-19 financial years.

- · Significant inadequacies in the Council's financial records have placed a significant limitation in the scope of my audit.
- As set out in my report in the public interest entitled Failure in Financial Management and Fraud, issued in August 2022, the Council's accounts for 2019-20 include £34,987 (2018-19 - £25,502) of unlawful expenditure due to fraud by the former Clerk.

Arrangements to secure value for money

As a consequence of the failures in financial management and governance identified in my report in the public interest, in my opinion the Council did not have in place proper arrangements to secure value for money in 2018-19.

Other matters arising and recommendations

Annual Governance Statement

I draw attention to the Council's disclosure that it failed to establish proper financial management and governance arrangements during 2017-18. This disclosure reflects the serious deficiencies identified in my report in the public interest entitled Failure in Financial Management and Fraud, issued in August 2022.
